### **Tutorials**

From next week, students will attend either UCAS Tutorials or Apprenticeship/Employment Tutorials.

During these Apprenticeship/Employment Tutorials, students are supported with:

- Reading and interpreting job descriptions and person specifications
- Drafting CVs
- Writing cover letters
- Types of interview and interview skills
- Assessment days and types of activities
- Using social media / online presence
- Searching for and applying for vacancies





### Levels of Apprenticeship

#### **Degree Apprenticeships**

- Sometimes referred to as a L6 apprenticeship
- Qualification gained is equivalent to a degree

#### **Higher Apprenticeships**

- Sometimes referred to as a L4 (or L5) apprenticeship
- Qualification gained is on same level as first year (or first two years) of a degree

#### **Advanced Apprenticeships**

- Sometimes referred to as a L3 apprenticeship
- Qualification gained is on same level to studies at New College, eg A-levels or BTEC Nationals

For all of these, study is usually done on a 'block release' or 'one day per week' format, but it depends on the employer



 Students often look at the rate of pay and say it is lower than they would expect – but remember, the employer is also paying for the cost of the qualification

- Higher and degree apprenticeships (L4, L5 or L6) can offer pay in the region of £14000 to £26000
- Advanced (L3) usually pay in the region of £10000 to £14000 per year
- The key thing to remember is that you'll usually be offered a higher rate of pay when you qualify

## Searching for apprenticeships

Use the websites to set-up alerts for opportunities in particular sectors and areas

Focus on higher and degree level apprenticeships (Level 4 and above) for now

many vacancies for September 2023 are being advertised now

After March/April, widen the net to advanced apprenticeships (Level 3)

-these typically have shorter lead in times so current adverts will be for earlier start dates



### Little but often

- Check vacancies / alerts each week
- Keep a record of where you've applied to
- Progress Tutors will ask students for regular updates this is so that we can identify further support or opportunities

Be wary of the apprenticeship that isn't an apprenticeship – some job adverts may use the term 'apprenticeship' but with very little details of the qualification available and vague information about the rates of pay – we would encourage students to make sure they know what the progression routes are!

These are likely to be found on job sites rather than specific apprenticeship sites mentioned previously.





## Searching for employment vacancies

- Some students do secure employment that isn't an apprenticeship
- This is fine though we would always encourage students to secure positions aimed at college / 6<sup>th</sup> form leavers rather than ordinary school leavers so that they are in a stronger position to progress
- Some students also opt to increase their hours at their current part-time job as they
  come to the end of their studies because they know there is the possibility of
  progression
- Either way, there is no need to look for employment vacancies until April / May as most vacancies will be for jobs that need to start soon
- Therefore, in the first instance, we would always encourage students to consider an apprenticeship







#### **Top 10 Advertised Occupations:**



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






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

#### Key message

To secure apprenticeships or employment with **higher salaries**, students will need to **cast their net wider than Doncaster** 





### **Armed Forces**

For students interested in the Armed Forces, we would encourage them to visit their local careers office by February, if they haven't done already.

- Police
  For students interested in the Police, we would encourage them to regularly check the recruitment websites of local police forces, so that they do not miss upcoming opportunities. Doncaster is close to lots of neighbouring police areas:
  - South Yorkshire Police
  - West Yorkshire Police
  - **Nottinghamshire Police**
  - Lincolnshire Police
  - North Yorkshire Police
  - **Humberside Police**
  - **British Transport Police**
- We would also encourage students to apply for Professional Policing courses at university in addition to any apprenticeship vacancies as they are few and far between

Students should also consider joining as a Special Constable when they are 18, particularly if they are set on waiting for an apprenticeship vacancy and are unsuccessful this year



### Fire Service

- For students interested in the Fire Service, we would encourage them to regularly check the recruitment websites of local fire and rescue services, so that they do not miss upcoming opportunities. Doncaster is close to lots of neighbouring fire and rescue areas:
  - South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue
  - West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue
  - Nottinghamshire Fire and Rescue
  - Lincolnshire Fire and Rescue
  - North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue
  - Humberside Fire and Rescue

Students should also consider joining as a Volunteer Firefighter when they are 18, whilst they wait for opportunities to arise
