EXAMS

Year 12 BTEC & CTEC External Examinations

A number of courses have external examinations taking place in May 2025. These are critically important examinations that contribute to students' final grades.

Timetables for these exams will be available to students via Cedar nearer the time.

Year 12 Progression Exams

Progression Exams take place for a large number of qualifications in June. The exams are carried out in formal exam conditions between Monday 16 June and Friday 20 June and more details will be shared nearer the time regarding the arrangements, including timetables and lessons during the week of exams.

The best way that students can prepare for the final progression exams is to ensure they have worked hard and revised throughout the year, in preparation for the regular monthly assessments. Students will be encouraged to develop a 12-week revision plan after February half-term.







Attendance

Overall attendance in college has been very strong this term. Analysis for sixth form colleges nationally demonstrates the significant impact of attendance on student results. Nationally, for students with 95% attendance or above, 22% of all A level grades exceeded minimum target grade. Students whose attendance falls below 90%, which constitutes persistence absence, inevitably tend to underachieve.

We have recently written to all parents and carers with details of their child's attendance so far this year, and you can check this yourself throughout the year by logging into Cedar.

Thank you to parents and carers that are regularly logging into Cedar to track student attendance, progress, support and intervention. You can also use the system to directly email a student's progress tutor and teachers.
